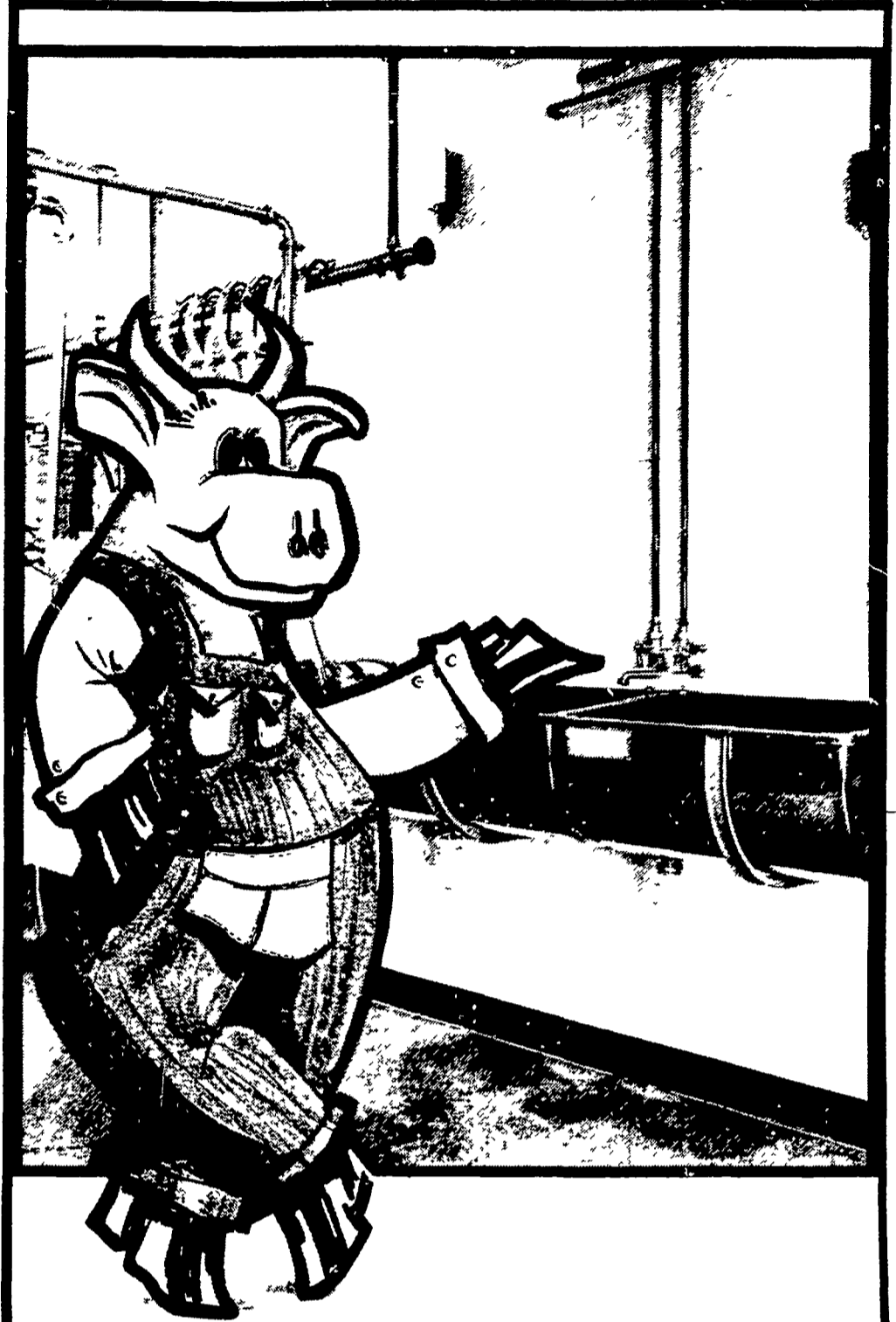
Dauphin Co. Society 16

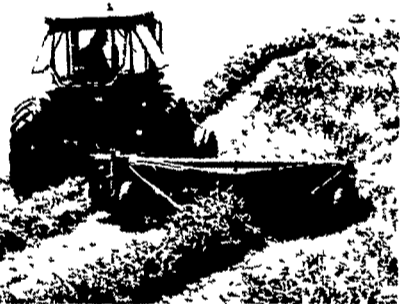

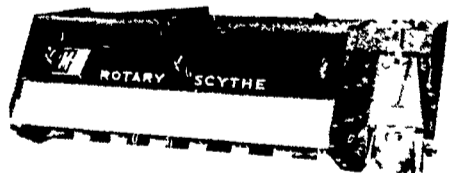
