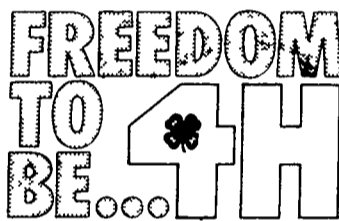
LAMPETER — The Lampeter-Strasburg Merry Maids 4-H Club met recently. The projects to choose from were sewing, cooking, and cake decorating.

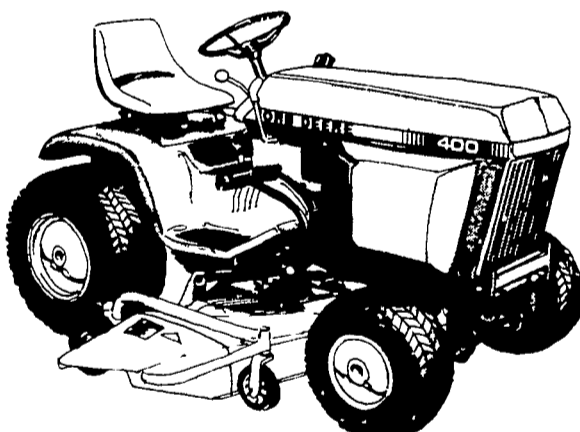

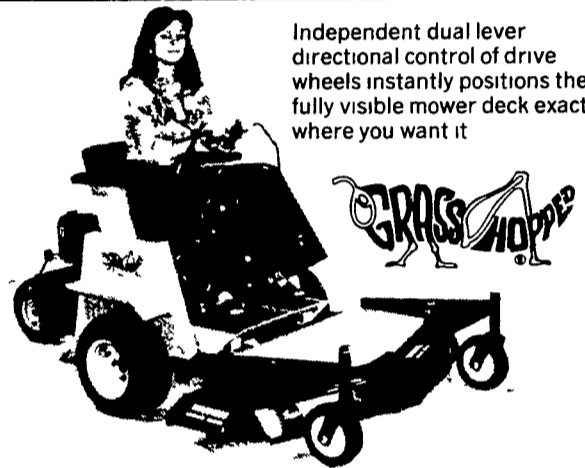
