How to control aquatic weeds in farm ponds and lakes

"All ponds have aquatic plants of some kind," said Russell James, aquatic biologist from Scranton. "But plants are only weeds

The growth of water weeds generally corresponds to warming weathering in the spring, James said.

He emphasized that early action against undesirable aquatic plants-by attacking the problem when it's smallcan eliminate far more costly problems later in the summer.

The first step in controlling aquatic weeds involves pond construction, according to the Department of Agriculture. Most plants grow best in shallow areas and one possible solution to weed problems may be to cut the shoreline so it slopes abruptly. But even in wellbuilt ponds, water weeds will gradually build up just as they do in a field. And not surprisingly, the cure is the

To clear a small area, the weeds can be pulled out by hand, but this can be a chore. Another alternative is to mechanically remove them with an underwater cutting device. But this is costly and frequently ineffective. Certain weed species, for example, are spread when they are broken up by machines, making the resulting problems worse than before.

Generally, chemical control is recognized as the most effective and economical method for attacking water weeds. An early preventive maintenance program using a broad spectrum aquatic herbicide can prevent weed infestations without harming fish and game. According to James, Diquat is considered the heavyweight aquatic herbicide because it controls weeds in all four categoriessubmergent, emergent, floating and algae.

If you recognize or suspect a weed problem in your pond, it's a good idea to seek professional advice. Your county extension agent, local fish and game representative, ag-chemical dealer or custom applicator are good sources for information.


