

# Cedar Crest Young Farmers receive awards

**SCHAEFFERSTOWN** — Awards honoring various production achievements during the past year were presented at the 16th annual banquet of the Cedar Crest Young Farmer Association Tuesday night at the Schaefferstown Fire Hall.

First-place award winners in the production categories received plaques. Included among the award categories and recipients were:

**Corn Yield** — Ferndale Farms, R1 Lebanon, with a yield of 171.1 bushels an acre, first, and Hershey Bare, R2 Lebanon, 158.6 bushels, second.

**Hay Quality** — First Cutting Alfalfa, Richard Bomberger, 1933 S. 5th Ave., Lebanon, first, and Ferndale Farms, second; Latter Cuttings, Elwood Houser, R5 Lebanon, first, and Richard Kreider, 1601 Prescott Rd., Lebanon, second.

Bomberger took the grand champion alfalfa award and Ferndale Farms was first in the Mixed Hay.

**Silage Quality** — Corn Silage, Houser, first, and

There were three award categories under dairy production.

**High Individual Cow Production** — Arnold Acres, R2 Lebanon, 26,294 lbs. of milk, first, and Arthur and Donald Krall, 200 Flintville Rd., Lebanon, 26,261 lbs. of milk, second.

**High Individual Cow Fat Production** — Ferndale Farms, first, with 1,019 lbs. and Arthur and Don Krall, second, with 987 lbs.

**Largest Increase in Herd Average Milk** — Charles Heffelfinger, 5 Heffelfinger Rd., Lebanon, with a hike of 3,317 lbs. and Ferndale Farms, second, with an

increase of 1,126 lbs.

Among other awards for 1979 were those given to Outstanding Young Farmers and for Community Service on the chapter and Region

VII levels.

Winners included Carl Reist, 1407 S. 5th Ave., Lebanon, in the PYFA category under 30 years of age; Leon Arnold, R7

Lebanon, over 30; and Mr. and Mrs. Richard Kreider, community service.

retiring as Assistant Superintendent of the Cornwall-Lebanon School District. He was presented an Honorary Young Farmer Degree.
