

Future of tobacco seen in marketplace

RALEIGH, N.C. — The future for the tobacco industry and any other farm crop in a free society lies in the marketplace and "not in government supply-management," Robert B. Delano said here Tuesday.

Delano, president of the American Farm Bureau Federation, spoke at the annual membership meeting of the Flue-cured Tobacco Cooperative Stabilization Corporation, a member-owned cooperative marketing association.

Noting that the U.S. share of the world tobacco market drops each year, Delano said. "This is a signal that something is drastically wrong with production methods which have become static under the present tobacco programs."

The farm leader urged tobacco producers to mechanize and upgrade

production techniques to keep up with world competition.

Delano said the export value of U.S. tobacco leaf and products is more than two billion dollars annually.

"Those export figures are small compared to what they could be if modern farming techniques were turned loose to produce the U.S. tobacco crop on efficient-sized acreage," Delano said.

"Under those conditions, we would out-produce and out-compete any country in the world."

Delano also noted that federal, state and local

government taxes on tobacco and tobacco products amount to about \$1.30 for every tobacco stalk

grown or about \$6 billion annually—three times the total gross revenue to producers.
