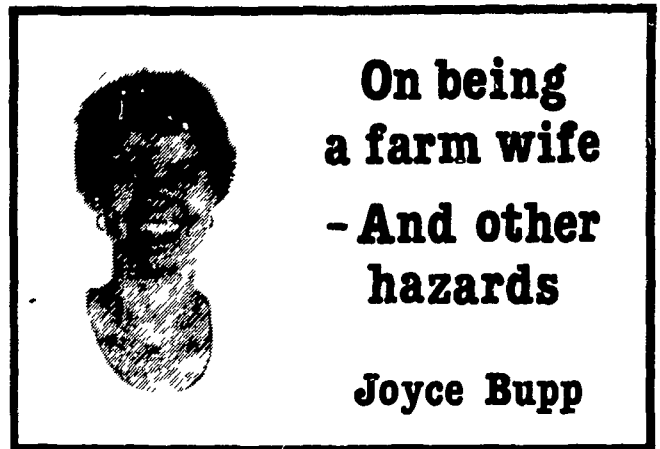
Beth Shugart, 17, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Nevin C Shugart, Mechanicsburg.

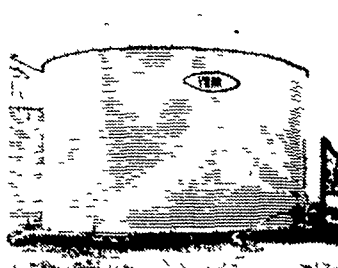

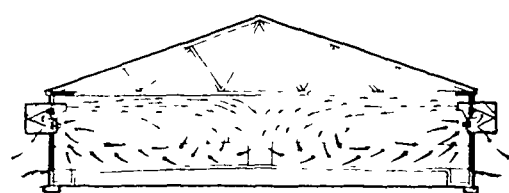

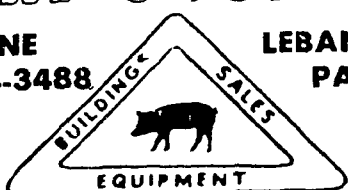
