Serving as judges for the competition were County Agent Arnold Lueck and Karen Masters, summer assistant in horticulture.

LANDISBURG — The Perry County 4-H Dairy Club met on June 5, 1980, at the Duane Richard Farm, Landisburg.

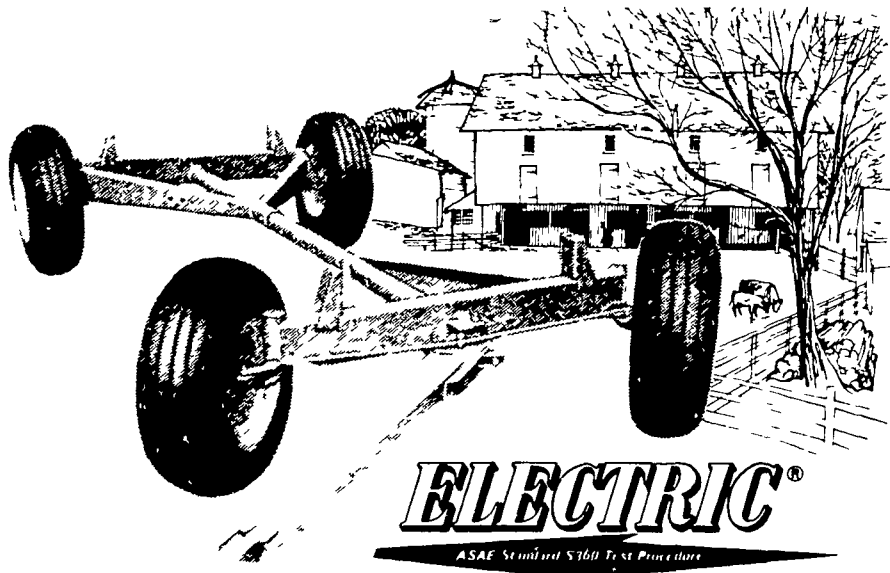

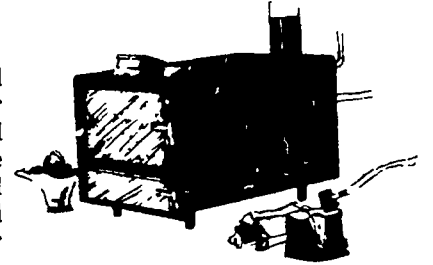
