## Order 4's May price set at \$13.09

ALEXANDRIA, VA — Middle Atlantic Order Market Administrator Joseph D. Shine Tuesday announced a May 1980 base milk price of \$13.09 per hundredweight and an excess milk price of \$11.49.

The weighted average May price is \$12.87 and the butterfat differential for the month is 15.7 cents. The May base milk price is up 10 cents from April 1980 and is 92 cents higher than last May.

Order 4 prices are announced for 3.5 percent milk f.o.b. plant location within 55 miles of Philadelphia, and also within 75 miles from the nearer of Washington, DC or Baltimore, MD. There is a 6-cent direct-delivery differential applicable to producer milk received at plants located within 55 miles of Philadelphia.

Shine said producer receipts totaled 498.4 million pounds during May, an increase of 1.7 percent from the previous month, on a daily basis, and 2.3 percent above last May.

Class I producer milk totaled 242.5 million pounds and accounted for 48.86

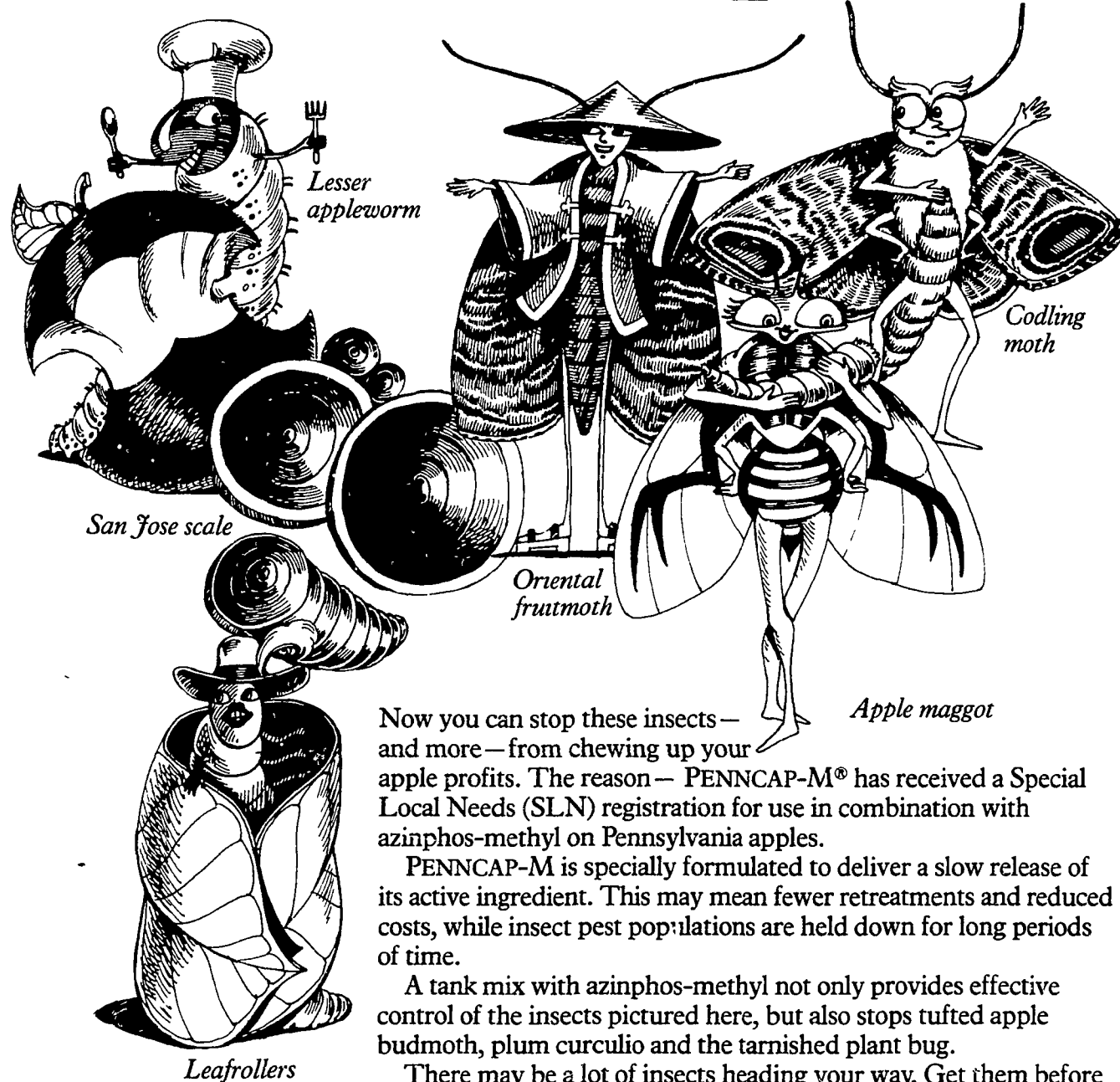
percent of total producer milk receipts during the month, down from 49.96 percent in April and below the 50.02 Class I utilization percentage last May.

Base milk accounted for 86.90 percent of total producer milk receipts in May, nearly the same percentage as a year earlier. There were 7315 producers supplying Order 4 handlers during the month and the average daily delivery per producer of 2198 pounds was up 16 pounds from April and was 22 pounds or 1.0 percent above last May.

The average butterfat test of producer milk was 3.60 percent in May compared to 3.58 percent last year.

Middle Atlantic Order pool handlers reported Class I in-area sales of 6.9 million pounds per day during May, an increase of 1.2 percent from last May, after adjustment to eliminate variation due to calendar composition.
