In the Junior steer show, two brothers took home the top honors. Charlie Conrad,

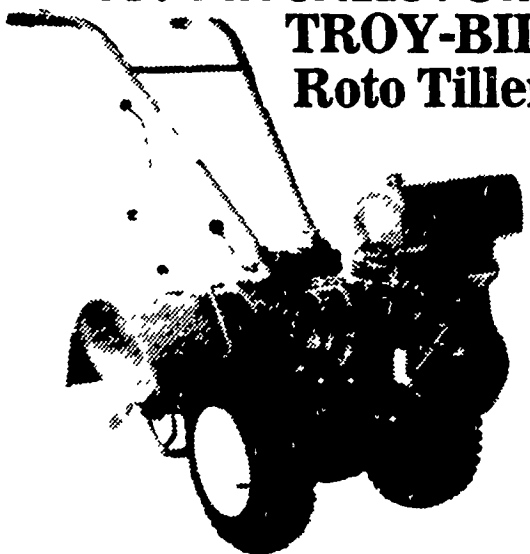
Rockport, W.V., and his brother Joe captured the grand and reserve grand championship placings respectively.
