## Broiler placements rise


HARRISBURG

Placements of broiler chicks in the Commonwealth during the week ending June 7 were 2,566,000, according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service.

The placements were eight percent above the corresponding week a year earlier and 15 percent above the previous week. Average placements during the past nine weeks were four percent above a year earlier.

Placements in the 21 key poultry production states were 83,139,000, one percent above the previous week but two percent below the same week a year earlier. Average placements during the past nine weeks were two percent below a year ago.

Broiler-fryers slaughtered in Pennsylvania under federal inspection during the week ending May 28 totaled 1,596,000, with an average liveweight of 4.02 pounds.



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


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
