Nat'l Jr. Shorthorn show is slated for July

MANHATTAN, Ks. — The 1980 National Junior Shorthorn Heifer Show will be held here July 12-15, at the Riley County Fairgrounds, according to Alan K. Sears, Junior activities director for the American Shorthorn Association.

Sears said the over 300 entries expected from across the United States will offer an unprecedented quality show on a national level for any breed.

The event will carry the theme "Decade of Direction" as the Shorthorn/Polled Shorthorn breed enters the 80's. Cattle exhibited in this show by members of the American Junior Shorthorn Association have continued on as national winners in later open competition in the past, Sears said.

"It will be an opportunity for spectators to view some excellent showmanship

abilities, quality sportsmanship in youth, and it promises to provide an exhibit of some of the most outstanding cattle to be seen in the country today," he said.

In addition to regular individual classes, special emphasis will be placed on unique competition that includes best bred and owned by Junior exhibitor, best pair owned by Junior exhibitor, best group of four from one state and herdsmen awards for state groups. The show will involve competition for some \$4,000 in premiums, Sears added.

The three man composite judging system will be used in the placing of the classes that begin at 8 a.m. on Friday, July 18. Serving as members of the placing team will be Robert Douthitt from Windholme Farm, Orange, Va.; Dr. Bill

Jacobs, California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo, Ca.; and Joe M. Lewis, Larned, Ks.

An added feature of the four day event will be hosted at Kansas State University in Manhattan when keynote speakers will give presentations on a wide variety of topics that pertain directly to the beef cattle industry. This seminar type program, also geared toward "Decade of Direction", will be conducted on the University

campus in Weber Hall, beginning at 10 a.m. on Thursday, July 17.

This national youth event is one of several summer activities sponsored by the American Junior Shorthorn Association in cooperation with the American Shorthorn Association, universities and other educational facilities, and firms and individuals interested in the development of youth in the beef cattle industry, Sears said.

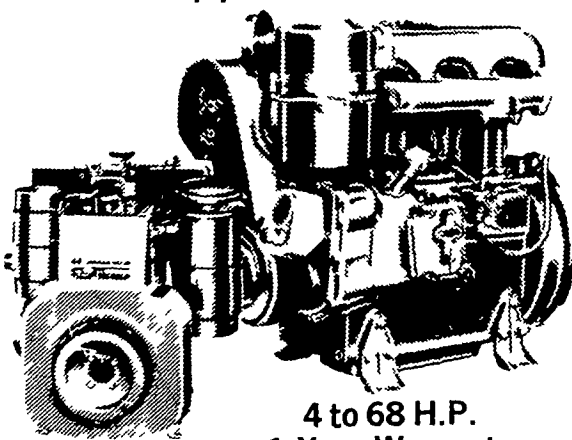
