ANSWER: Behavior modification is the process of changing the way we eat, not just what we eat. In a behavior medification

program, suggestions are made on how to identify the emotional states that casue you to eat more, how to know when you are experiencing "real" and "imagined" hunger, how you can avoid the temptations of eating between meals, and how to eat less.

The behavior modification approach to diet is a responsible way to learn new eating habits that can last a lifetime. This is a far better

way to lose weight, and keep it off, than crash diets and fad diets that usually only produce temporary results.

I have tried dozens of diets, but is seems that my weight loss only lasts a little while, and then I end up weighing more! Help!

ANSWER. Millions of people experience the same problem because they have not gotten to the heart of why they are overweight. The fact is that most of us eat more calories than our physical activity burns up. Dieting is only successful if you choose a diet that you can live with the rest of your life. It is better to go on a diet which results in gradual weight reduction instead of a crash diet which will allow rapid weight loss only to be followed by an equally rapid return of the overweight state. Ideally, meals should be composed of small portions of a wide variety of foods, including meats, poultry, fish, fresh fruits and vegetables, whole grain breads and cereals and lowfat dairy products. Behavior modification programs may help you to learn what triggers your desire to eat so that you can cope with it more successfully. Don't

Farmers warned about sales

ANNAPOLIS, Md.

Another warning to farmers about pesticide telephone salesmen is being sounded by the Maryland Department of Agriculture's David Shriver who says his counterparts in Virginia have alerted him to a problem which has been happening on that state's portion of the Eastern Shore.

Shriver, Chief of MDA's Pesticide Applicator Law Section, says the latest concern stems from efforts by telephone salesmen who try to sell an apparent bargain herbicide to farmers and nurserymen.

He says, "The key to the problem, and what farmers should watch out for, is the fact that the material comes in a very diluted form when delivered, instead of the concentrated form the buyer thinks he is purchasing. Therefore, the bargain aspect disappears and it's no savings at all."

"The best advice is to beware of telephone calls from strangers offering deals and fancy claims, Shriver concluded. "Buy from known dealers and firms and be sure to check out all the facts before buying any pesticide."
