

Karen Sattazahn named Berks dairy princess

WYOMISSING — When toastmaster Ernest Miller announced the name of the 1980 Berks County Dairy Princess last Saturday evening, 20-year-old Karen Sattazahn surely looked surprised.

The only daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Sattazahn, Womelsdorf, beamed with excitement. She had entered the pageant under the encouragement and persuasion of her mother and a member on the dairy princess pageant committee without giving much thought to the possibility of winning. However, Karen naturally possesses the necessary characteristics and enthusiasm needed to fill the position.

She has always helped around her father's farm as long as she can remember and has been actively involved in dairy clubs since she became old enough to enter 4-H. Karen also enjoys

meeting people and will do her best as spokesman for the Berks County dairy industry.

Selected as Karen's alternate during the pageant held at the Sheraton Berkshire Inn, was 21-year-old Janice Savidge. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Savidge, R2 Mertztown. Janice also displayed the natural charm and enthusiasm which is looked for in a dairy princess. During the evening program in which the young ladies were crowned, Janice did a skit with her cow "Moo-Shine", a life sized replica of a dairy cow created by the alternate princess herself.

Janice is a graduate of Brandywine High School and is presently employed by Caloric Corporation as a draftsman. Janice has remained active on the family farm however, helping out after work and on weekends. She has served as past president of vocational Industrial Clubs of America and is an advisor

of Youth Ministry, a member of the church choir and of the Longswamp Lioness Club.

Janice has three brothers, Donald 23; Lee, 19; and Richard, 16. The Savidges are presently milking 50 cows and farming approximately 250 acres. They also have 32 heifers and twenty steers. Although never having shown dairy cattle personally, Janice has helped her brothers prepare for shows. She became interested in becoming a dairy princess after seeing other princesses at local events and because she feels the need to promote her family's major commodity—MILK. The new county dairy princess is a graduate of Conrad Weiser High School

and presently is a student at Kutztown State College, studying elementary education and library science. Karen will be entering her third year of college in September.

During the summer and on weekends while in school, Karen is employed on her family farm, Zahnheim Holsteins. Her basic duties include milking, driving tractor, especially during hay season, feeding, and gardening. Karen has two younger brothers, Kevin, aged 17, and Kirk, 8 years old.

The Sattazahns maintain a herd of approximately 100 Holsteins, and are presently milking 74. They also farm






