

In the last issue of the American Farm Bureau Federation's "Dairy Situation" was a one liner I just couldn't resist repeating.

After a story on the commercial use of dairy products in 1979 that showed only cheese sales had increased while butter, powder and frozen product sales all declined, there followed another paragraph explaining that cheese was so popular because it was delicious, nutritious, available in 200 domestic varieties, and economical with no waste.

Then came the punch line which someone should put on a bumper sticker for June Dairy Month — "What a friend we have in cheeses!"

Lookin' Good
Things are looking good for the new Agway-H.P. Hood milk marketing venture called Agri-Mark. Even though the solicitation of members was

two weeks late getting started, they signed up over a billion pounds of milk in the first week and now have passed the two billion pound mark. They need an annual volume of three billion and believe that it's only a matter of getting around to all the farmers.

Reports are that refusals have been very few. Now they're working on the fence sitters and so it will only take a few more weeks.

All the organizational machinery has been set up, including the liquidation and dissolution of Yankee Milk whose assets will be sold to Agri-Mark subject to the approval of the board of directors. Even the Yankee member equity plan was amended to conform with the Agri-Mark plan.

A "structure committee" has been named to form the new cooperative and has already approved by-laws, quality standards, milk promotion contributions and a dues structure, as well as

WHAT'S NEW

EPHRATA — Chore-Time Equipment, Inc. has introduced an entirely new air-moving machine created to help farmers control their energy costs. The new fan is designed to meet the ventilation needs of poultry and livestock confinement houses.

Named the Metre Fan because of its one metre (approximately 40 inches) diameter, the fan achieves an ideal balance of energy efficiency, air moving performance, and long-life reliability, according to

naming an interim board of directors.

Most of the members of the new cooperative were Yankee members or Hood Producers. All of them are contributing 94 cents a hundred pounds of a year's milk production to raise \$28 million to help finance the purchase of the Hood facilities.

Agway will contribute another \$28 million to close the deal when enough farmers sign up to guarantee the milk supply.

Easily the most ambitious effort in eastern milk marketing ventures, it is attracting national attention and may set a pattern for similar structures if it is as successful as hoped.


