## Pond problems reviewed at Lebanon farm

LEBANON - An enthusiastic and appreciative audience of about 60 people attended the farm pond management meeting at the farm of Cyrus Bomberger, Colebrook Road, last Thursday evening.

Speakers included Terry D. Rader, Extension Forest Wildlife Specialist from Penn State. He spoke on species of fish to stock either single species or a combination of species.

"For single species, bass alone could be stocked, he said. "Bass - blue gill (sunfish) or bass - golden shiner are preferred stockings."

William Snyder, Waterways Patrolman for the Pennsylvania Fish Commission, told those in attendance that the farm families and farm employees who reside on the farm are not subject to the same regulations as those enforced in streams and lakes. The farm families and employees may fish without a license in their farm ponds,

Karl Hellerick, District

Conservationist, Soil Conservation Service, talked briefly on pond site selection and construction

Robert G Wingard, Extension Forest Resource Specialist, discussed the need to properly identify pond weeds before starting a control program.

"When the weed is identified, the volume of water must be calculated to determine the amount of herbicide to use, he said. He also stressed the need to obtain a permit to treat aquatic weeds in farm ponds. The permit is free and forms can be obtained from Fish Commission or Penn State Extension personnel.

Dennis Hoke, County Agent, noted attendees will now meet requirements for re-certificatin of their private application license for purchase and use of certain pesticides.

Before leaving, many of those in attendance took a close look at the well managed Bomberger pond and observed many large
