

Home gardeners can cope with flooding

COLLEGE PARK, Md. — If summertime floodwaters cover your garden, you should assume that your vegetables are contaminated, says Charles A. McClurg, Extension vegetables specialist and associate professor of horticulture at the University of Maryland in College Park.

"Unless you are sure there is no danger from bacterial contamination, don't use fruits and vegetables that were ready for harvest at the time of flooding—unless they can be disinfected, peeled and thoroughly cooked."

Leafy vegetables, such as lettuce, cabbage, mustard, kale, collards, spinach, Swiss chard and celery, are the most susceptible to bacterial contamination from floodwaters, he said.

Also highly susceptible are fleshy vegetables and berry

fruits such as tomatoes, summer squash, strawberries, and peppers.

Root, bulb and tuber crops are less susceptible to bacterial contamination from floodwaters. This category includes beets, carrots, radishes, turnips, onions and potatoes.

"In general, fruits and vegetables that were immature at the time of flooding should be safe to eat by the time they are ready for harvest," said McClurg. "For additional safety, you may wish to disinfect your produce or cook it before eating."

Disinfecting measures include one or more of the following:

—Wash in a strong detergent solution with a scrub brush. Remove all silt;

—Immerse produce for 15 to 20 minutes in a weak

chlorine solution. Household bleaches can be used for this purpose. They should be diluted liberally with water. Use three-fourths of a tablespoon of high-chlorine bleach (6%), or two tablespoons of low-chlorine (2%) bleach, in a gallon of water.

—Rinse thoroughly with safe drinking water;

—Peel, if possible, and cook thoroughly before eating;

Refer specific questions to health authorities, or to local offices of the Cooperative Extension Service, he concluded.
