MARSHALL, Va. — Jimmy Pruitt, 13 of The Plains, Va. showed both the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Market Hogs at the 1980 Fauquier Jr. Livestock Show and Sale held at Marshall,

The Champion was a purebred Hampshire that weighed 265 pounds. He had a 38 inch carcass with a 4.1 lion eye and 1.1 inches of backfat and a dressed weight of 173 lbs.

The Reserved Champion was a Hamp-York Cross that weighed 305 lbs. and graded No. 1. He had a 42 inch carcass with a 5.1 inch loin eye and .75 inch of back fat.
