Sunshine means good working, but hurts soil moisture

HARRISBURG — The summer weather over the commonwealth provided farmers with six days suitable for fieldwork during the week ending June 30. But while the dry weather helped fieldwork, soil moisture dipped to low levels.

Harvest was reported at its peak across the state for strawberries, with large berries being harvested. Cherries and raspberries were also being harvested. Cherries, apples and peaches are reported to be sizing well, with few problems. Recent warm weather has increased the growth rate for sweet corn,

tomatoes and other garden crops.

Soil moisture was mostly short to adequate, with a 50-50 breakdown in the north. Central counties reported 100 percent short supplies and the south reported 82 percent short to 18 percent adequate soil moisture.

Corn is averaging 16 inches through the state, on a par with last year. Corn heights in the state average 4, 13 and 21 inches in the north, central and southern areas, respectively.

Barley harvest has begun, with 16 percent done. Barley is now 12 percent headed 34 percent turning and 38

percent ripe. Last year, 16 percent was headed, 41 percent turning, 28 percent ripe and 15 percent harvested.

Northern areas report 54 percent headed, 45 percent turning and less than five percent ripe, while central areas are at 42 percent turning 45 percent ripe and 13 percent harvested.

Southern areas are at 18 percent turning, 53 percent ripe and 29 percent harvested.

Wheat is now 56 percent headed, 39 percent turning and five percent ripe, compared to 37 percent headed and 63 percent turning last year. The north is 78 percent headed and 22 percent turning, central areas are 62 percent headed and 38 percent turning, and the south stands at 28 per-

cent headed, 57 percent turning and 15 percent ripe.

Oats are 62 percent headed compared to 65 percent last year. The north is at 37 percent, central areas are 65 percent and the south is at 88 percent headed.

First cutting of alfalfa is 89 percent complete compared to 84 percent last year. The central and southern counties are at 95 and 97 percent harvested, respectively, while the north trails at 75 percent.

Second cutting of alfalfa is at eight percent, compared to six percent at this time last year.

Clover-timothy stands are 77 percent harvested, compared to 74 percent last year. The north reports 66 percent harvested, the central area is at 77 percent and the south is now 89 percent harvested.
