Pest control is too important to trust to anyone else

Be sure to introduce a source of decomposing bacteria. A rich garden soil can be used to get bacteria into the pile Soil can be added to each layer of organic matter, followed by a light compacting

Aerate the compost pile or bin regularly

suitable Maintain moisture levels in areas with low summer rainfall

Add heat generating materials such as grass clippings or high carbohydrages when sterilization is desired.

Shredding helps make uniform compost, but it is not essential.

You can use the compost as soon as it has decomposed to the desired texture It may be incorporated into the soil to maintain tilth and friability, or it may be used on the surface for weed control and water conservation In the fall. compost may be combined with soils to make excellent potting media for house plants
