Final plans were made to host a picnic supper for the Halcyon Club of Lebanon at South Hills Park.

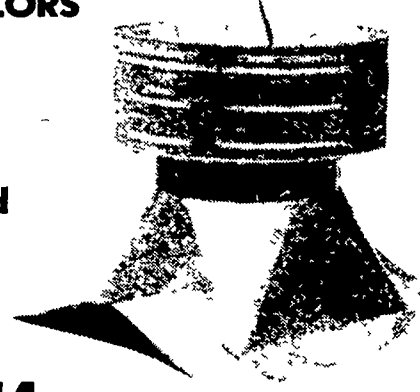
The next meeting will be on Tuesday, August 12 at 7:30 p.m. The group will meet at Kauffmans of Rehrersburg for an evening of miniature golf.

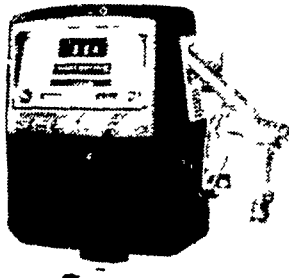

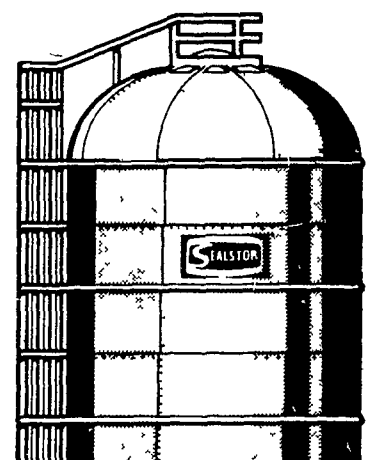
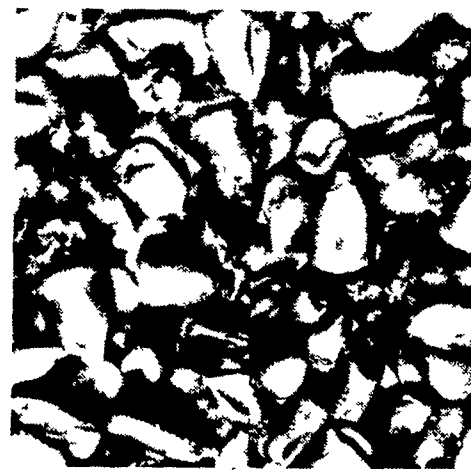
