Order 4 June base pegged at \$13.08

ALEXANDRIA, Va. — Middle Atlantic Order Market Administrator Joseph D. Shine Thursday announced a June 1980 base milk price of \$13.08 per hundredweight and an excess milk price of \$11.52.

The weighted average June price is \$12.90 and the butterfat differential for the month is 16.0 cents.

The June base milk price is down one cent from May 1980 but is 91 cents higher than last June.

Order 4 prices are announced for 3.5 percent milk f.o.b. plant location within 55 miles of Philadelphia, and also within 75 miles from the nearer of Washington, DC or Baltimore, MD. There is a 6-cent direct-delivery differential applicable to producer milk received at plants located within 55 miles of Philadelphia.

Shine said producer receipts totaled 462.6 million pounds during June, a decrease of 4.1 percent from the previous month, on a

daily basis, but 3.3 percent above last June.

Class I producer milk totaled 219.2 million pounds and accounted for 47.39 percent of total producer milk receipts during the month, down from 48.66 percent in May and below the 50.60 Class I utilization percentage last June.

Base milk accounted for 88.82 percent of total producer milk receipts in June, down slightly from a year earlier.

There were 7326 producers supplying Order 4 handlers during the month and the average daily delivery per producer of 2105 pounds was down 93 pounds from May but was 33 pounds or 1.6 percent above last June.

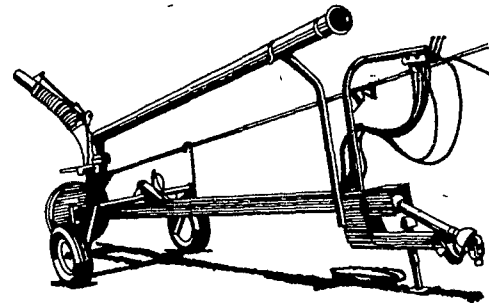
The average butterfat test of producer milk was 3.56 percent in June compared to 3.53 percent last year.

Middle Atlantic Order pool handlers reported Class I in-area milk sales of 6.2 million pounds per day during June, a decrease of 3.7 percent

from last June, after adjustment to eliminate variation due to calendar composition.
