The heifer, B-V Pinky Pride 49 is only the second Angus Chris has ever registered. 'Killer', as the heifer is affectionately

called, is sired by Walbridge Milestone and out of Rally Pinky Pride 47, Chris' 1978 show heifer she purchased from Rally Farms, Millbrook, N.Y.

Showing as an April yearling, Killer has already taken the numerous awards this year. 1980 Reserve Angus Calf Cnampion at the Pennsylvania Farm Show; Supreme Champion at the York Baby Beef Preview Show 1980; Reserve Champion Bred and Owned Heifer at the Northeastern National Junior Angus Show, held in Maryland; Reserve Champion Bred and Owned at the Southeastern National Junior Angus Show in

Georgia. The daughter of Mr. and Mrs Gordon D Shive, Seven Valleys, Chris will be entering the 9th grade this Fall Versatile and outgoing, Chris is active in both church and school activities. A

member of both the State and National Junior Angus Association, she holds the office of News reporter in the state association.

A member of 4-H tor 6 years, Chris has carried such projects as beef breeding and finishing, rabbits; capons; bicycle; cooking and sewing, meats and livestock judging, teen leader; and many more.

In her 4-H career, Chris has won numerous championships with her rabbit projects. She also had the 1976 Grand Champion Steer at the York-Adams 4-H Roundup and in 1978 had both the Grand and Reserve Champion 4-H Angus Heifers.

Chris will be competing in State 4-H Days in August for the first time. She will be presenting the Demonstration on Tympany (Bloat) that won her top honors at county and district levels

In judging contests, s was on the High Junior Team at the York County Livestock Contest held last week, placing 8th overall, 5th in swine, and 4th in beef Chris also placed 5th in sheep at the Spring Judging Contest held at Penn State.
