State milk production up 4% in June

HARRISBURG — Milk production in Pennsylvania during June 1980 totaled 726 million pounds, up four percent from a year earlier according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service.

The number of milk cows in the Commonwealth during June was 705,000 head, up 9000 head from a year ago. Milk production per cow averaged 1030 pounds in June, up 25 pounds from a year ago.

United States milk production during June totaled 11.41 billion pounds, four percent above June 1979.

Milk production per cow averaged 1055 pounds, 33 pounds more than a year earlier and 51 pounds above June 1978. Milk cows on farms totaled 10.8 million, one percent above last year.

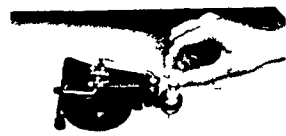

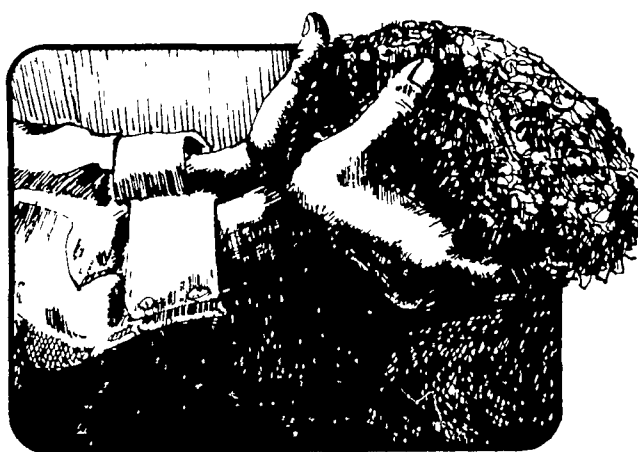
