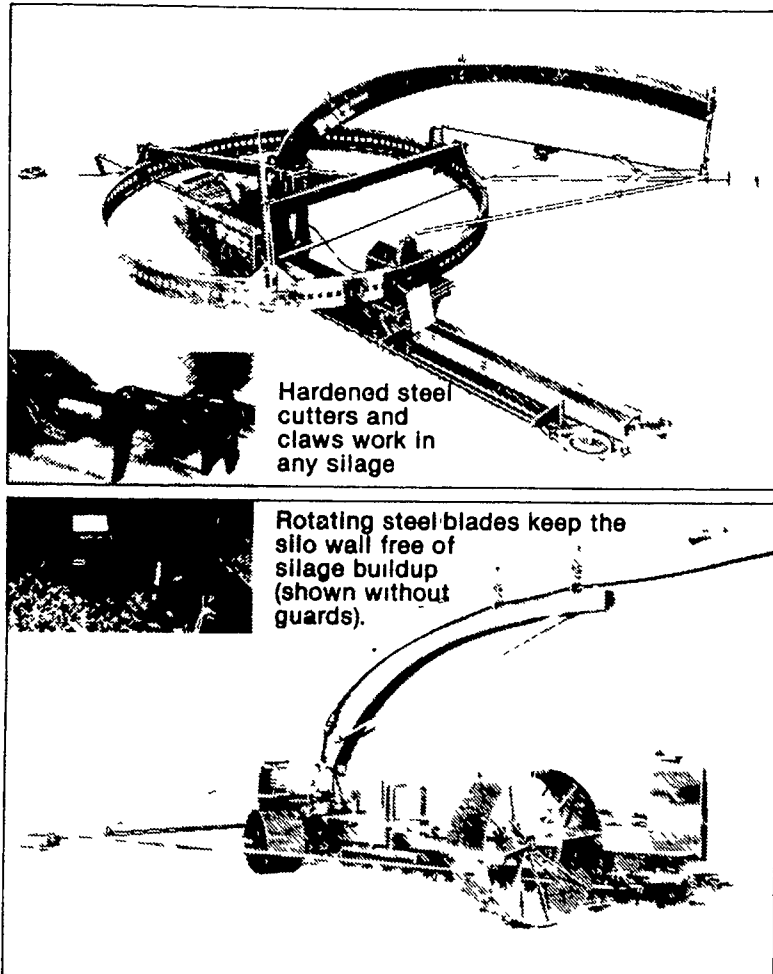

Premium catalogs now available for NAILE

LOUISVILLE, Ky. — Premium catalogs for the 1980 North American International Livestock Exposition, November 8-22, are now available, announced Expo General Manager Harold Workman.

The catalogs contain pertinent information relating to every livestock category that will compete at the November show, and at no charge, Workman added.

Total premiums to be awarded during the two-week long Expo, which is entering its seventh year, will be \$250,000. The NAILE will again be held at the Kentucky Fair and Exposition Center, Louisville, Kentucky.

The complete schedule of events for the 1980 NAILE was also announced. Many activities of interest to the general public, as well as those involved in the livestock industry, will be held throughout the Exposition.

The North American International will be the

showplace for over 12,000 entries this year in the categories of beef cattle, dairy cattle, sheep, swine and Quarter Horses. Also featured will be several major sales. Some of the finest livestock in the United States and from several foreign countries participate in the NAILE.

Entry deadlines, also announced by Mr. Workman today, are: Dairy — September 20; Beef, Sheep and

Swine — October 1. Quarter Horse entry dates, which were announced previously, vary according to class and event.

The event was staged at the Queensgate Shopping Center in York

Registration was open all day for the contest, then a drawing selected ten registrants to compete for the \$200 first prize. The contest was heavily promoted on radio, which the family farm operation uses continuously for its two primary markets, York and Baltimore. Maryland A

professional announcer was employed for "running commentary" during the unusual and crowd-pleasing event

Leo Garcia of York emerged the Champ this year downing 28 eggs while calmly allowing his daughter to witness the accomplishment from his lap

Last year's winner, in the year of the contest, Harold Frazier of Red Lion ate 35 eggs in a half hour. The Guinness World Book of Records is 44 eggs

Contestants are permitted to salt the eggs and drink any substance that will aid them in their effort. Most chose water

The Deputy Secretary of Agriculture for Pennsylvania, Chet Heim, Egg Promotion Specialist, Vicky Wass, Pennsylvania Produced Promotion Coordinator, Barbara Constanza, and Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Poultry Federation, John Hoffman, were on hand to witness and capitalize on the event for Pennsylvania agriculture

The contest is just one of the many publicity activities the promotion-oriented farm engages in annually
