

Tobacco field day to run this Wednesday

UPPER MARLBORO, Md. — The thirtieth annual Maryland tobacco field day is set for this Wednesday (July 30) at the University of Maryland's tobacco research farm near Upper Marlboro.

This year's blue mold plant disease epidemic will probably be the big topic of conversation, even though recent hot weather appears to have brought the malady to a standstill, reports Claude G. McKee, Extension tobacco specialist and professor of agronomy on the University of Maryland faculty.

McKee is also field day coordinator and tobacco farm superintendent. He expects more than 600 persons to attend this week's event.

The field day schedule calls for wagon tours of research plots on a con-

tinuous basis from 9:30 a.m. to noon, with each trip lasting about 1½ hours. The last wagon train will probably leave the tobacco farm headquarters area about 11 a.m.

Topics at the six tour stops are as follows:

Tobacco variety breeding — M. Kenneth Aycock, Jr., professor of agronomy at the University of Maryland in College Park;

Weed control — Ronald L. Ritter, Extension weed control specialist and assistant professor of agronomy at the University of Maryland;

Research on blue mold — Harold A. ("Jerry") Skoog, a tobacco research agronomist at nearby Beltsville, Md., for the U.S. Department of Agriculture;

Tobacco insects — Floyd P. Harrison, professor of entomology at the Univer-

sity of Maryland in College Park;

Keeping MH (maleic hydrazide) residues down — Claude G. McKee

Curing studies with Maryland tobacco — Barry C. Frey, assistant professor of agricultural engineering, and Gerald L. Long, an agricultural engineering technician, both at the University of Maryland in College Park.

Noon lunch will be sold at moderate cost, as usual, in the shade of tall linden trees near the farmhouse headquarters.

Speakers for a short afternoon program will include W. Lamar Harris, director of the Maryland

Agricultural Experiment Station, and James R. Miller, agronomy department chairman — both headquartered at the University of Maryland in College Park.

Displays of tobacco-related farm equipment and appropriate educational exhibits will be available for viewing throughout the day. Field demonstrations of tobacco-related equipment will be conducted in the afternoon.

The University of Maryland tobacco research farm is located four miles north of Upper Marlboro on highway 202. All interested persons are invited to attend next week's field day.
