

## New management setup announced by Dairylea

## Corn in farmer-owned reserve released

LEESPORT — Producers may redeem corn from the farmer-owned grain reserve without penalty as the national average market price for corn is \$2.63 per bushel, the reserve release level, according to a spokesperson for the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service.

Ray Fitzgerald, Executive Vice-President of the Commodity Credit Corporation, said farmers may sell their reserve corn after repaying their CCC price support loans. Release of the reserve, however, does not require farmers to redeem or sell their grain at this time.

Farmers with farm-stored reserve grain must request a release from the county office of USDA's ASCS before removing the grain for sale.

The \$2.63 price level at which corn is released from the reserve is based on 125

percent of the \$2.10 per bushel national loan rate of corn.

About 894 million bushels of corn are in the reserve.

On August 29, CCC will review the average price for corn to determine whether the release authorization should remain in effect. For loans not redeemed, storage earnings will continue through the end of August.

Data used by CCC in determining the release level include five-day average prices as reported by USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service which show prices bid by buyers at selected markets. Chicago, Kansas City, Minneapolis, Omaha and St. Louis are the daily markets reviewed by CCC for corn. The five-day average of these market prices, adjusted to reflect prices received by farmers, was the basis for the release action.
