

Corn, soybean session set for Wednesday

NEWARK, Del. — Farmers and others interested in agriculture will have a chance to look at current research and extension efforts into improving the production of corn and soybeans at the upcoming Field Day at the University of Delaware's College of Agricultural Sciences.

The event will be held Wednesday morning, August 6, from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. at

the University's experimental farm on Route 896 in Newark.

The Field Day will consist of wagon tours of field demonstration plots, and will emphasize some of the Delaware Agricultural Experiment Station's most recent and innovative research efforts on behalf of corn, soybean, and turfgrass production in the state.

should be confined for the day of the visits and owners should plan to spend about 2 hours with the researchers during the first visit, then perhaps one hour for remaining visits.

Identification of flocks will remain confidential and the study will be conducted at no cost to producers

Through this on-the-farm research, a profile of parasites infesting southeastern Pennsylvania sheep will be developed—species of parasites, relative numbers, seasonal changes. This information will allow researchers to plan and test strategic methods of eliminating the parasite problem.

Knowledge of nutrient contents of local feeds and pastures will allow them to

formulate specific supplements necessary to lower feed costs while maintaining optimal nutrition and eliminating nutritional diseases. The economic relationship between parasites, feeding and disease with lamb growth, breeding efficiency and returns from sales of meat, wool and individual sheep will be studied. This information will allow researchers to predict the potential benefits of veterinary services to flocks, and also to determine costs of feeding, vaccinations, wormings, etc., in relation to returns to the producer
