One of Eileen's favorite recipes follows

### MUSICAL PIE

1/2 cup semi-sweet chocolate pieces  
1/4 cup butter  
1 cup chocolate flavored Rice Crispies  
1 1/2 pints vanilla ice cream (softened)  
1/2 ounce unsweetened chocolate, coarsely shredded  
Melt chocolate pieces and butter in top of a double boiler on very low heat. Stir in cereal. Put in buttered 8" pie pan. Chill. Put ice cream in crust and sprinkle with chocolate. Freeze 4 hours. Before serving put pie pan on hot towel to unmold. Let soften a bit. Serves 6
