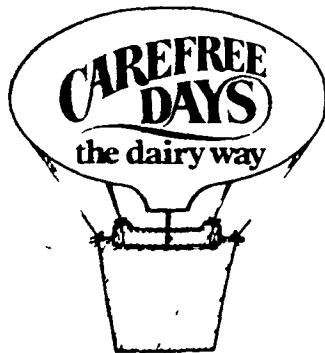
The theme of this year's family living activities is "Families Managing in the 80's," and family concerns such as health and nutrition, clothing, housing, and energy conservation ideas will be featured in exhibit and demonstrations throughout each day. Ag Progress Days visitors can browse through the tent, finding out about everything from affordable 1980's housing to delicious and nutritious low cost protein. Experts on food preservation techniques such as

home canning and herb drying will be available to provide suggestions and answer questions. Convection ovens, an innovation in countertop ovens, will be demonstrated and discussed. New types of window shades, designed to keep out summer sun and winter wind, will be among the exhibits emphasizing conservation of energy and money.

Even the children will enjoy the fun and learning by joining Extension nutrition aides leading games inside the tent.

The Family Living Tent activities are only one part of the 1980 Ag Progress Days. Billed as one of the largest outdoor agricultural events in the East, it has a variety of activities, planned

for maximum appeal for everyone, taking place throughout the three days. The event, sponsored by the Pennsylvania State University's College of Agriculture, is held annually at the Rock Springs Agricultural Research Center nine miles west of State College. Admission is free to everyone.
