#### State egg output climbs

HARRISBURG — June 1980 egg production in Pennsylvania totaled 338 million eggs, eight percent above the 312 million eggs produced in June 1979, according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service.


The June average of 15.9 million Pennsylvania layers was eight percent higher than a year ago Egg production per 100 layers was 2130 compared with 2,127 in June 1979

The nation's laying flocks produced 5.57 billion eggs during June 1980, one percent less than the 5 64 billion produced a year ago

All layers on hand July 1 totaled 280 million, one percent fewer than the 283 million a year earlier Egg production per 100 layers during the monmth was 1994 compared with 1992 a year
