

Schuylkill 4-H dairy show held

PITMAN — The annual Schuylkill County 4-H Dairy Show was held Saturday at the Carl A. Snyder farm here. Twenty-three 4-H'ers exhibited 36 dairy animals. These 4-H'ers represented all 3 county 4-H dairy clubs - Pitman, South Schuylkill and West Penn.

Donald A. Seipt, a partner in Keystone Farms, Northampton County, and a former member of the Cornell dairy judging team was the official judge for the show.

Show placings for the Jersey breed were Junior calf class - 1. Karin Heffner, R2 Pine Grove; 2. Bruce Rhein, Pine Grove. Junior yearling class - 1. Bruce Rhein; 2. Kristin Heffner, Pine Grove.

Spring yearling class - 1. Bruce Rhein. Bruce had the Jersey Junior Champion and Karin Heffner had the Junior Reserve Champion.

Jersey 3 and 4 year old class - 1. Kent Heffner, Pine Grove; 2. Bruce Rhein. Kent also had the Spring Champion and Bruce the Reserve Senior Champion.

Kent's entry Jersey Acres went on to become the Jersey Grand Champion and Bruce's Golden Royal Snowflake was named Reserve Grand Champion.

In the Guernsey breed competition, Carl Miller of R3, Tamaqua, had first place in the Junior Yearling Class and William Romberger, Pitman, had first place in the Senior Yearling Class. Romberger's entry was named Junior Champion of the Guerneys and Miller's Reserve Junior Champion. Ryan Kahler, Pitman, placed first in the 3 and 4 Year Old Class and William Romberger placed 2nd. These entries were also awarded Senior Champion and Reserve Senior Champion respectively and also went on to win Guernsey Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion.

The Brown Swiss breed competition saw Rick Daubert, Pine Grove, place first in the Junior Calf Class. First place in the Senior Calf Class went to Allen Daubert, Pine Grove, with Randy Miller, Tamaqua, placing 2nd. The Junior Yearling Class was won by Rick Daubert with Ann Daubert, Pine Grove, placing 2nd. Allen Daubert won the first place award for the Senior Yearling Class. Rick Daubert was awarded the Junior Champion Award and Allen Daubert the Reserve Junior Champion Award. In the 2 Year Old Class Ann Daubert's entry finished first followed by Rick Daubert in second and Randy Miller 3rd. The 3 and 4 Year Old Class was won by Allen Daubert who also captured the Senior Champion and Grand Champion award. The Reserve Senior Champion went to Ann Daubert and the Reserve Grand Champion to Rick Daubert.

The Holstein judging saw Kent Miller, Tamaqua, placing first and Mark Snyder, Pitman, 2nd in the Junior Calf Class. Kevin Brown, RD Pine Grove, placed first in the Intermediate Calf Class with Nelson Moyer, Schuylkill Haven, placing 2nd. In the Senior Calf Class Tracy Snyder, Pitman, finished first followed by Mabelle Moyer, Schuylkill Haven, 2nd and Mike Snyder, Pitman, 3rd. Brian Ruch, New Ringgold, captured 1st in the Jr. Yearling Class and Rebecca Wolfe, Pine Grove, had 2nd place. The Senior Yearling Class was won by Tracy Snyder, Kevin Wolfe, Pine Grove, had 2nd and Ryan Kahler, Pitman, finished 3rd. Tracy Snyder's entries won both the Junior Champion and the Reserve Junior Champion awards. Steve Snyder, Pitman, had the top placed two year old. Tracy Snyder won the 3 and 4 year old competition and Mark Snyder captured the aged cow class. The Senior Champion and Grand Champion went to Tracy Snyder and the Reserve Senior and Reserve Grand Champion to Steve Snyder. Kent Heffner was awarded a trophy for best in the Senior showmanship competition and Rick Daubert received a trophy for the Junior Division. William Romberger captured the Senior Fitting trophy and the Junior Division trophy went to Kristin Heffner. Many of the 4-H'ers competing in Saturday's

New FFA film to focus on outside classroom learning

ALEXANDRIA, Va. — A new film designed to explain and strengthen the role of practical experience in vocational agriculture will soon be produced by the Future Farmers of America through the sponsorship of CIBA-GEIGY Corporation, Greensboro, North Carolina, FFA officials have announced.

Under the working title, The Strong Link, the film will have as its primary audience Vo-Ag students, their parents and potential employers. It will focus on the important linkage of classroom learning, hands-on experience and leadership development that makes up a total vocational agriculture/FFA educational program.

"Supervised Occupational Experience is what makes the vocational agriculture program vocational," commented Byron Rawls, National FFA Advisor. "We feel that we need to better communicate the need for a total Vo-Ag/FFA program that includes an experience program and the fact that it makes for better preparation of young people for the world of work."

The project, sponsored by CIBA-GEIGY through the National FFA Foundation, includes production of the film and the making of 100 prints for free-loan distribution to high school Vo-Ag programs across the United States.

FFA officials are looking to a possible Spring 1981 release of the film, though operational plans are still tentative.

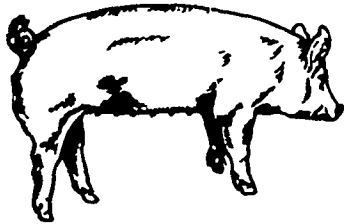
