No. 6-1, had an outstanding ADG of 2.67 pounds per day, The second high indexing

This pen of Yorkshires had an ADG of 2.24 pounds per day and a feed conversion of 2.35 pounds of feed per pound gain. Their percent lean cut was 63.4 percent with a loin eye area of 5.11 square inches and fat of 0.71 inches.

Yorkshire boars, these finished the test with an ADG of 2.27 pounds and a -teed conversion of 2.36 pounds of feed for every pound of gain. The percent lean cut on the pen was 60.3 percent with 0.90 fat and 5.32 square inches of loin eye.




