

Frey bull wins at Indiana State Fair



INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. — The grand champion bull at the Indiana State Fair Angus Show was an entry co-owned by Fred C. Frey & Sons of Quarryville and Continental Associates, Phelps, New York.

The bull, Continental, was tagged Senior Champion by judge Jim Hough of Ardmore, Tennessee on his way to the top honors.

Following Continental in both the Reserve Senior Champion and Reserve Grand Champion slot was Craft Lucky Strike. Three owners share this champion. They include Robert Zeedyk, New Carlisle, Indiana; Lucky Strike Breeders, Grass Lake Michigan; and Steve Silbernagel, Napoleon, North Dakota.

Judge Hough went to the junior division for both top honors in the female show.

Grand Champion was Kendall First Lady, co-owned by Mr. and Mrs. Sayre MacLeod, Sayre Farms, Phelps, New York; and Scott Talbott Jr., Lexington, Kentucky.

Premier Angus Inc., Cloverdale, Indiana, led out the Reserve Grand Champion, Premier Baroness 2088T.

Sayre Farms grouped Sayre Patriot progeny to top the Senior Get Class and exhibited the Best Pair of bulls.

Premier Angus Inc.

earned first in Junior Get competition with offspring of Le Mar Eileenmere Lad 549, Skyhigh; led out the Best Six Head; and claimed the Premier Breeder banner.

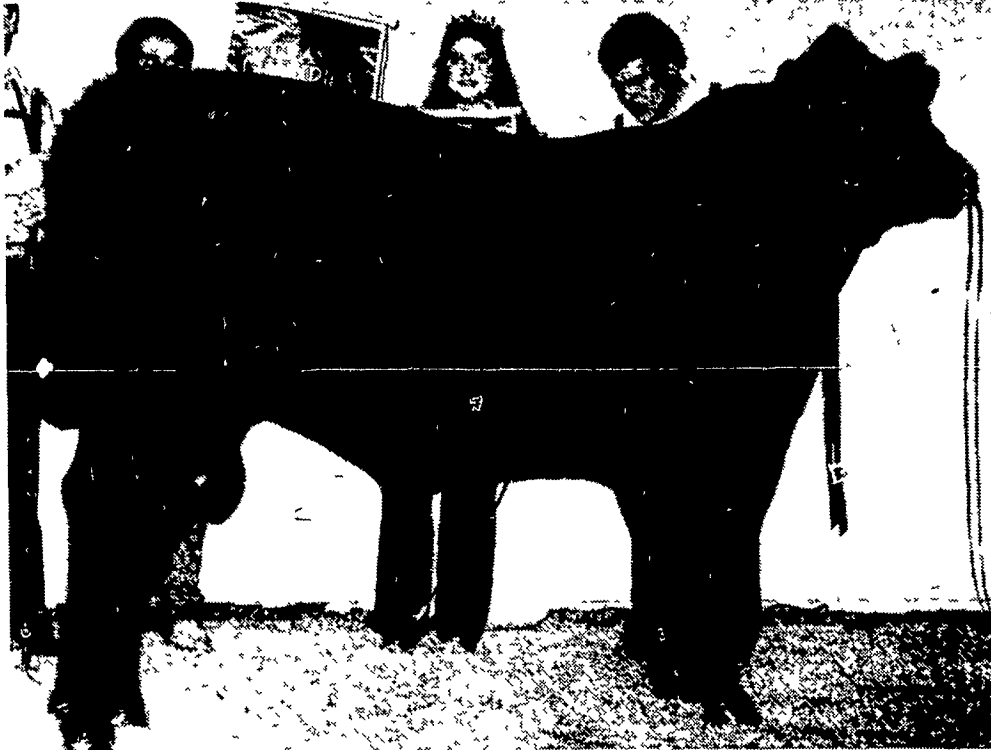

Jane Dawes, Urbana, Indiana, owned the Bull Calf Champion, DD Black Stud 929, and Premier Angus Inc. exhibited the Reserve, Premier Skyhigh 2343T.

Patriot Lady 965 was the Intermediate Champion female exhibited by Kevin Reeser, LeRoy, Illinois. Sayre Farms took Reserve on Blackcap 434L of Sayre.

Patriots Jestress Gal 160F was the Heifer Calf Champion owned by Gallagher's Farm, Ghent, New York; and Sayre Farms. Double HH Farms, Adair, Illinois, owned the Reserve Calf Champion, Double HH Lass 0305.

FARMHAND Grinder - Blower

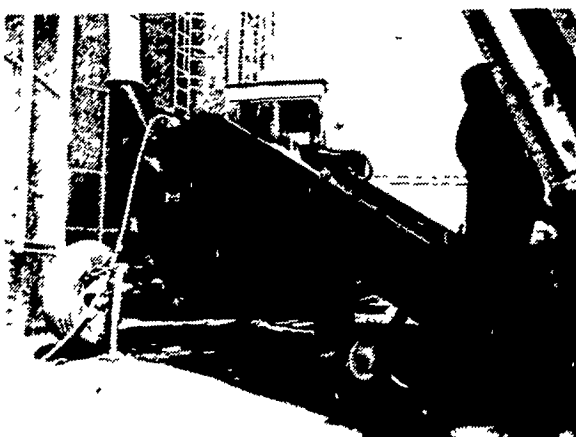
Versatility To Process All Your Feed Materials



Set up the Grinder-Blower for these feed handling jobs:

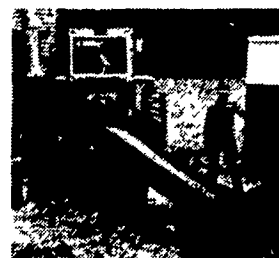


Grind up to 400 bales per hour with the optional bale conveyor door and bale grinding kit. Attach the dust collector (as shown) and grind into a feeder box, bunker or pit silo. The Farmhand Grinder-Blower can handle your feed grinding needs.



Grinding high moisture or dry ear corn and blowing into the tallest silos at rates up to 25 tons per hour is possible with the Grinder-Blower. The machine may be equipped with an optional 8' flair hopper drop feeder to feed the belt conveyor door or the gravity flow door.

A special bar screen is designed for reconstituting stover or grinding tough fibrous materials like corn cobs. Hammers pass between serrated edges to slice materials before they enter the blower chamber.



High-moisture corn can be processed up to 1,000 bu per hour with either the belt conveyor or the gravity door (shown). Corn can be cracked or ground by choosing any of 13 screens. If screens are removed, corn is just blown into storage without grinding.
