ASA supports soybean disaster payments

ST. LOUIS, Mo. — The American Soybean Association has told congressional leaders it does not oppose a disaster payment program for soybean growers.

"Soybean growers deserve some protection from disasters such as the current drought which has severely injured much of the 1980 soybean crop in the South and Midwest" said ASA President Frank Ray of Baker, Florida.

"We do support a soybean disaster payment program if it can be designed without the need for soybean target prices or other forms of

government intervention. At the same time, we continue to oppose any legislation which authorizes the Secretary of Agriculture to establish a soybean target price, a soybean reserve program or a soybean set-aside."

ASA noted a soybean disaster payment program would be difficult to implement because the government lacks comprehensive soybean yield data that is used to calculate damage. Such information is available for wheat, feed grains, cotton and rice — all of which currently have disaster payment programs
