

Centre County Jr. Sale has record gross

The 1980 Centre County Junior Livestock Sale had the largest gross dollar volume in its ten-year history. After all the bidding was over, 208 head of hogs, lambs, and steers brought a grand total of \$78,789.75. These animals were exhibited by 4-H and FFA members in the Junior Livestock Show at the Centre

County Grange Fair. One-hundred head of hogs were sold for a total of \$18,068.77 for an average of \$92.21 per cwt including the Grand and Reserve Grand Champion and \$87.81 per cwt not including the champions.

The Grand Champion market hog, a 238-pound Duroc barrow, exhibited by Richard Homan, R1 Centre Hall, was purchased by Hatfield Packing Co for \$3.45 per pound. The Reserve Grand Champion market hog, a 248-pound Yorkshire gilt shown by Scott Hazlett of State College, was purchased by the Penn Hi-Boy Restaurant and Witmer Construction both of State College for \$2.15 per pound.

Forty-six market lambs were sold for a total of \$4372.75, with an average of \$106.12 per cwt including the Grand and Reserve Grand Champion and \$91.51 per cwt not including the champions.

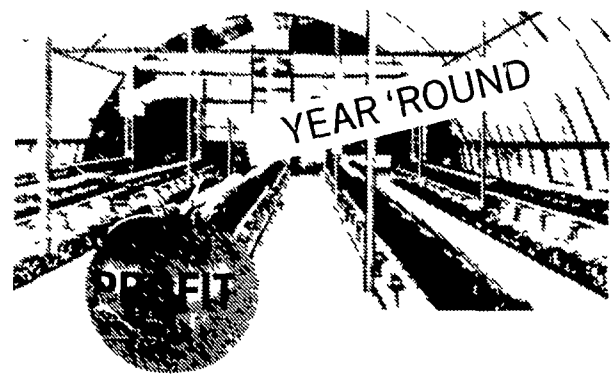
Pleasant Gap was purchased by Bierly's Meat Market from State College for \$4.20 per pound. The Reserve Grand Champion market lamb, an 118 pound Hamp-

shire whether, was shown by David Harpster, Boalsburg, and purchased by the Autoport Restaurant of State College for \$3.50 per pound.

Sixty-two market steers were sold for a total of \$56,348.23 with an average of \$87.14 per cwt including the Grand and Reserve Grand Champions and \$84.57 not including the champions. The Grand Champion

steer, a 1145-pound red Angus, was shown by Steve Peters of Pa. Furnace and purchased by the Autoport Restaurant, State College, for \$1.57 per pound. The Reserve Grand Champion, a 1105 pound Maine anjou crossbred steer was shown by Chad Cash, R D.1, Centre Hall and purchased by Landmark Dodge, State College, for \$1.60 per pound.

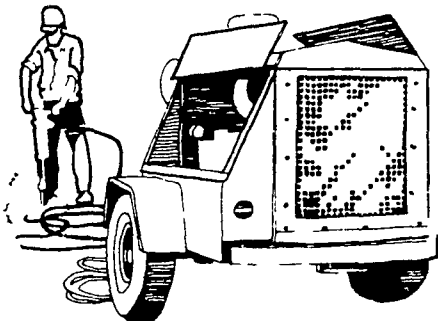
