CARBON COUNTY — Twenty six Carbon County 4-H exhibitors were \$5758 richer after their hogs were sold at the county fairgrounds recently. The 54 head sold averaged 60.9 cents per pound.

The sale was part of the 31st annual market show and sale for 4-H animals at the annual Carbon County Fair. The event was started in 1950 by Ray W. Reitz, who as county extension agent continues to oversee the event.

Diane Sheckler of Palmerton showed the grand champion hog of the show. Her 210-pound Dorac brought \$2.00 per pound at the sale. Steve Miller showed the reserve champion.

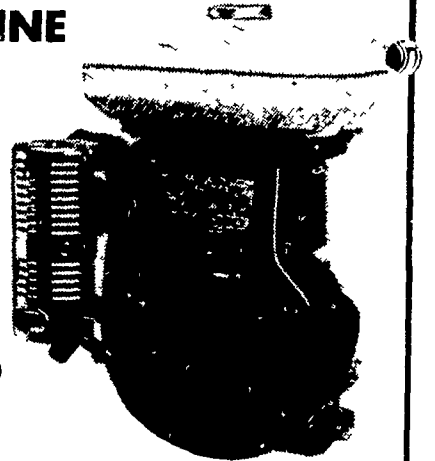
