

Order 4 milk price set at \$14.64

ALEXANDRIA, Va. — Joseph D. Shine today announced a Class I milk price of \$14.64 per hundredweight for October, 1980. This price is up 13 cents from the September price and is 77 cents above last October.

Order No. 4 prices are announced for mulk testing 3.5 percent butterfat, f.o.b. plants located within 55 miles of Philadelphia, Pa. and also within 75 miles from the nearer of Washington, D.C. or Baltimore, Md. There is also a 6-cent directdelivery differential applicable to producer milk received at plants located within 55 miles of Philadelphia.

Shine announced a Class II

milk price of \$11.98 per Middle Atlantic Order hundredweight for August Market Administrator 1980 and a butterfat differential of 16.6 cents for the month. The Class II milk price increased 20 cents from the previous month while the butterfat differential was up six tenths of a cent.

These class prices are based on the August 1980 Minnesota-Wisconsin manufacturing milk price of \$11.86 per hundredweight adjusted to a 3.5 percent butterfat content.

The USDA reported that the wholesale price of Grade A butter at Chicago for August was \$1.4446 per pound and the nonfat dry milk price was \$.8917 per pound, f.o.b. plants in the Chicago area.




