Farmers coming north from Lancaster should take the last Middletown exit,

also marked as the exit for Rt. 441.

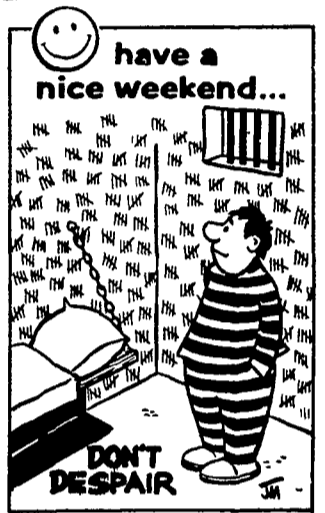

The Township Building is located about one half mile from the cloverleaf on the right side of the road.
