

Foreign ag trade seen as major state business

HARRISBURG — Pennsylvania Agriculture Secretary Penrose Hallowell last Friday said foreign agricultural trade has become a major industry in

the Pennsylvania economy. Hallowell told more than 40 export exhibitors participating in an Agriculture and Food Exposition in Philadelphia, "You are on the leading edge of an industry that is growing better by leaps and bounds. This year marks the 11th consecutive year of record food and farm exports.

"The agricultural export field has grown up in Pennsylvania and the northeastern United States to the point where it is a part of the regular marketing system, not just a means to dispose of surplus foods."

As vice-president of EUSAFEC (Eastern United States Agriculture and Food Export Council), Hallowell was hosting the exposition. Representatives of 15 Japanese firms were in Philadelphia on a buying mission which includes the one-day exposition at the Holiday Inn-City Line Avenue.

Japan is a major customer for U.S. agricultural and food products, annually importing \$4 billion in U.S. commodities for its 115 million consumers.

The Japanese buyers will make three other stops while

in the United States: in Houston, Kansas City and Seattle. They are interested in the full line of food and agricultural products, including fresh, frozen and canned dairy products, snack items, processed foods, feedstuffs and grains.

"Agricultural exports are predicted to reach \$40 billion in 1980," Hallowell said, "and to provide a national trade balance of \$22.5 billion."

Pennsylvania's share of the agricultural export market is increasing and should top \$200 million for the first time this year.

The Agriculture Secretary said farm and food exports increased by 20 percent in 1979, and noted that a similar increase this year could provide jobs for 2,000 Pennsylvanians.

"Economic development is a top priority of the Thornburgh Administration,"

agricultural exports can play an important part in development of our agribusiness economy," he said.

"As an agricultural state and a food processing and marketing center, Pennsylvania is in an excellent position to help fill the needs of potential foreign customers. We have the farm production capabilities, the capital and the know-how. We have the marketing, transportation and port facilities. We can be a reliable source of farm and food products for the export market," he said.

"I expect Pennsylvania's agribusiness enterprises will continue to expand."

The Japanese Buying Mission and the Agriculture and Food Exposition are being sponsored by EUSAFEC, the Foreign Agricultural Service and the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture.
