Large fruit supplies dampen price outlook

supplies of noncitrus fruit mean that grower prices for fresh and processing fruit this fall will stay below 1979 prices. Total 1980 noncitrus production is forecast to be marginally above last year's large crop.

In August, the index of prices received by growers for fresh and processing fruit was 207 (1967=100), 27 percent below August 1979. Nevertheless, retail prices will stay higher than those last year, as marketing and distribution costs continue to increase.

In total, noncitrus production is expected to be last year and about nine percent above 1978.
