## Cost sharing available to Carroll County farmers

WESTMINSTER, Md. -Farmers in the northwest section of Carroll County, Md., can now receive up to 75 percent cost sharing for installing measures to control animal waste and sediment pollution problems under the new, experimental Double Pipe Creek Rural Clean Water Program.

Maryland was one of 13 states to have its application for an RCWP project approved and was among the first three states to receive funding. Congress approved about \$3.9 million to provide technical and cost-sharing assistance to farmers in the area to clean up pollution problems over the next 10 years.

The program is administered by the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service through farmer-elected Carroll County ASC Committee. Technical assistance and other support is provided by the Soil Conservation Service, Carroll County Soil Conservation District, Extension Service, Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, and other interested groups

According to Randy Bachtel, SCS soil conservationist, the purpose of the program is to provide an incentive for farmers to voluntarily Many of the Training, Level III.
