# Milk plant workers' strike averted

SYRACUSE, N.Y. - A vote of all employees milk plant union workers strike which could have cost dairymen more than \$1 million per day in losses was narrowly voted down Sunday.

Members of eight Teamster locals voted 225 for the contract and 199 against.

But several of the operations were solidly against ratifying the con-

Union officials said they may push to have the vote talleyed at each plant and have each plant stand on its

Elmhurst Dairy sites at Prattsburg and Worcester, N.Y.; Empire Cheese, in Skaneateles Junction, N.Y.; and two of the three pollio Dairy plants voting all voted heavily against the contract.

Robert Forsythe, general manager of the Syracusebased Northeast Dairy

said the strike could have resulted in over seven million pounds of milk being dumped daily. Forsythe spoke on behalf of the milkshed's 10 major milk manufacturing plants.

Three major points were hashed out: workers' wages, pension benefits, and health and welfare contributions.

The offer made to the union by plant operators allows for an increase in the employee labor rate of 65 cents and hour this year followed by an additional 60 cents next year and a third increase of 60 cents in 1982.

That brings the total wage package to \$1.85 an hour over three years.

The dairies agreed to increase the current Health and Welfare contributions from the present rate of \$20 24 per employee per welfare fund.

Cooperative Federation, had week to \$25.24 per employee said the strike could have per week for 1980-81.

An additional one dollar will be given the third year to cover inflation.

Plans for the pension fund would sweeten the current \$13.30 per employee per week pot to \$15.30 this year and then raise it to \$17.30 in 1981-82.

The offer was said to be the richest ever made to employees by this group of plant operators.

In an attempt to avert a strike, New York's Governor Hugh Carey sent a state mediator to join the federal mediator and the two sides at the bargaining table.
