

## Milk advisory committee named

HARRISBURG — The Pennsylvania Dairy Promotion held at 10 a.m. on September 30 in the Agriculture Building in Harrisburg. The committee was selected to help draft a proposal for a referendum which, if approved by the majority of Pennsylvania's dairy producers, could become an effective statewide milk promotion marketing order.

Names of committee members finally were made public on Wednesday, a month after the Committee was scheduled to hold its first meeting.

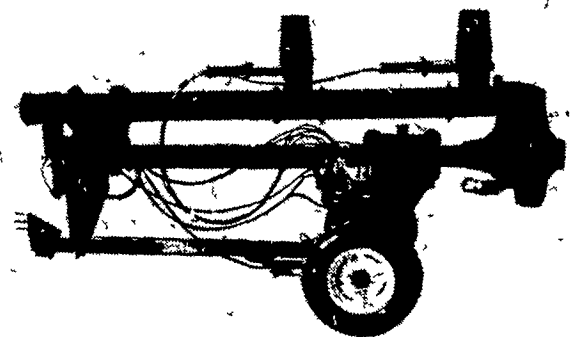
