

Poultry leaders to advise on panel

LANCASTER — The Secretary of Agriculture has retained the General Conference Committee of the National Poultry Improvement Plan as an official advisory committee on poultry health to the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

This is the only advisory committee whose members are elected by the affected industry rather than being appointed by the Secretary, according to P.R. "Bobby" Smith, Assistant Secretary of Agriculture for Marketing Services. Smith said that the committee must be renewed every two years.

The members for this term are Baxter C. Newton, Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Madison, Wis.; Monte Frazier, Arbor Acres Farm, Glastonbury, Conn.; Don Zander, H & N Research Laboratory, Redmond Wash.; Ken A.

Holleman, South Carolina Poultry Improvement Assn., Clemson, S.C.; Floyd A. Golan, Texas A & M University, College Station, Texas; Clifford L. Nelson, Iowa State University, Ames, Iowa; and Lee Arrendale, Fieldale Corp., Baldwin, Ga.

NPIP members study problems relating to poultry health and make recommendations to USDA about ways the department may assist the poultry industry.

NPIP is a voluntary state-federal program administered by USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service. The work of the plan is conducted in the participating states by official state agencies.

NPIP was organized in 1935 to coordinate individual state and industry efforts to control certain egg-

transmitted and hatchery-disseminated poultry diseases, especially pullorum and fowl typhoid. A continuing effort is being made to eliminate other egg-transmitted and hatchery-

disseminated diseases of poultry.

Notice of the Secretary's intent to continue the committee appeared in the September 2 Federal Register.

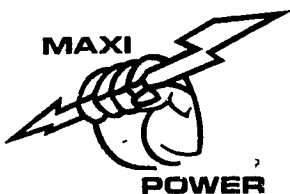
