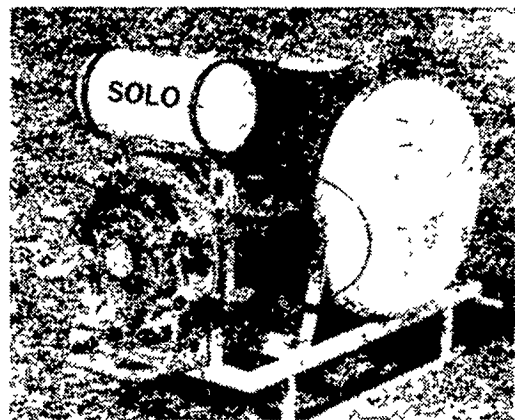

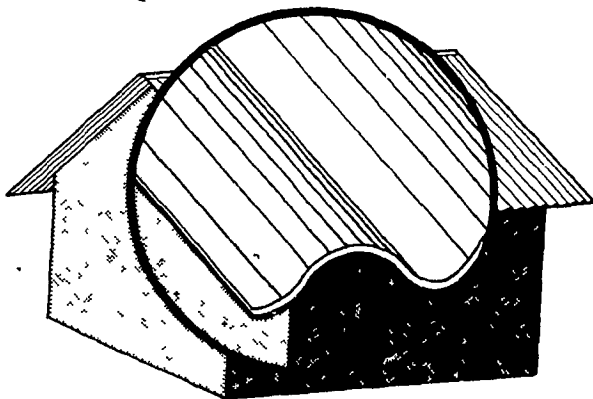
The secretary's report was read and approved. The treasurer, Joanne Roth, reported a balance of

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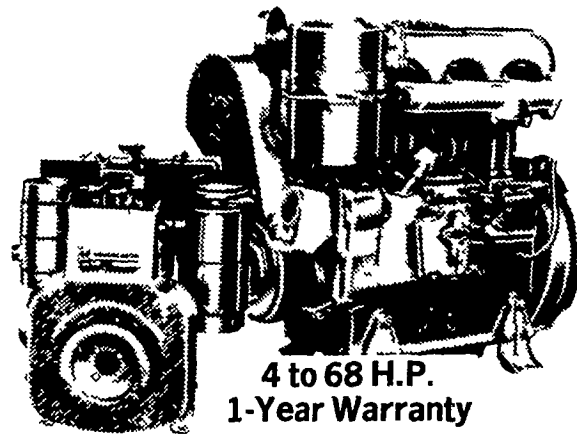
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
