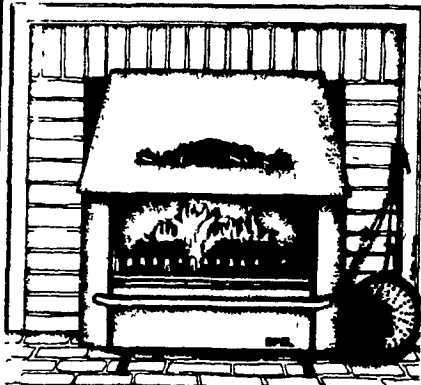
In 1979 he was nominated as the state's Outstanding 4-H Boy.

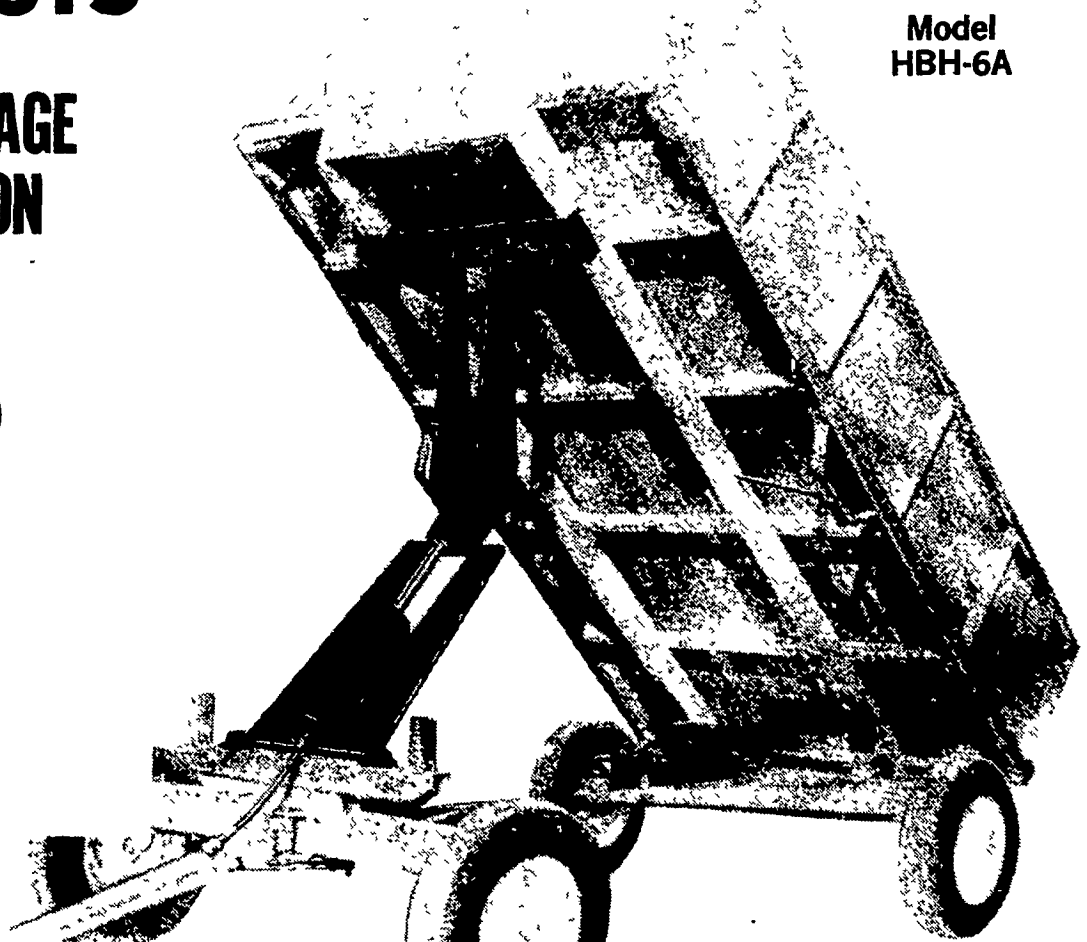

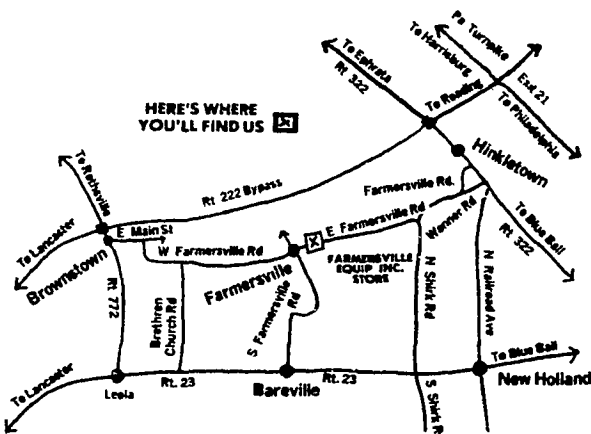
