By-products of livestock are also essential for our daily living—from leather shoes, lanolin in medication, wool clothing, to the life saving procaine valve for heart patients.

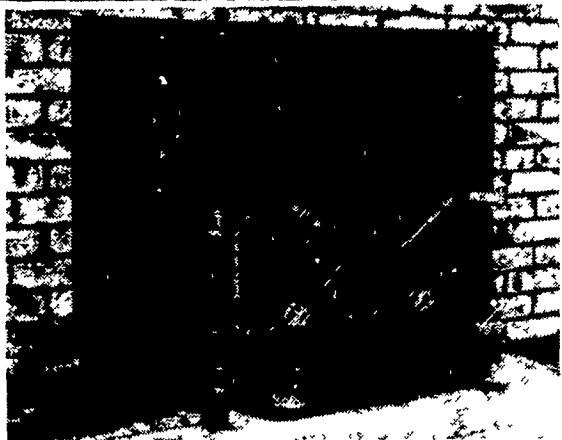

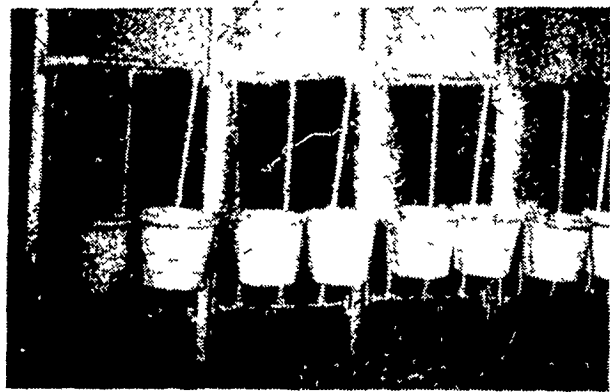
