KILE opens 24th annual show

HARRISBURG — The 24th Keystone International Livestock Exposition swung wide its doors and welcomed a record number of livestock exhibitors and visitors yesterday.

Pennsylvania Secretary of Agriculture Penrose Hallowell was on hand for the kick-off ceremonies and the official declaration of October as Livestock Month.

Friday's events included a first-time event for KILE with the premier Simmental breeding cattle show. Feeder calves and pigs were shown and sold. Other events included the Appaloosa horse show along with two breeding sheep shows, and the Charolais cattle show.

Also on hand was the Etzler sheep driving team and the ever-popular barnyard babies area.

This year's livestock entries showed a marked increase except in the swine division where the pseudorabies moratorium limited exhibitors to feeder pigs and market hogs only.

According to Charles Ite, show director, the number of cattle entered for this year's show totaled 1003, up 150 from last year. Horse

numbers came in at nearly 800 head which is about a 200 head increase over the 1979 KILE. Sheep numbers are also up, closing out at 1225 head.

Activities under the spacious Farm Show Complex roof continue to bustle today with more cattle shows, sheep and horse competition and the National 4-H Horse Bowl and Judging Contest. See the show scheduled on page A16.

The Agricultural Craft Show will be making its debut on Sunday, featuring all sorts of crafts that make use of agriculturally-related products. Kit Carson will be there with his hand-painted Ukrainian eggs, along with other craftsmen who use everything from corn cobs to wool to create their masterpieces.

Crowning Sunday's activities will be the selection of the Pennsylvania Lamb and Wool Queen. This will be followed by the ever popular Ladies Lead Class and the Junior sheep shearing contest.

Monday wraps up the 24th KILE with more sheep, hogs, cattle and horses.
