

Enders reflects on 4-H years

MOUNTVILLE - As the latest crop of 4-H'ers prepares to attend National 4-H Club Congress in Chicago, Deborah Enders, 3203 Horizon Drive, Lancaster, looks back on her experience there as a highlight of her ten years in 4-H.

Deborah 19, was selected to attend two years ago, as a winner in the conservation project. She recalls that her selection as a state winner

was a surprise because it was the first time she had entered the awards program. She says the experience of traveling to Chicago, staying at the Conrad Hilton Hotel and meeting people from all over the state and the nation was something she'll always remember. "You can't believe the really outstanding people who attend," she states.

Being involved with 4-H has been a part of most of Deb's life as a teenager, and she seems to thrive on helping others with their projects. "I really enjoy working with kids. I like watching them compete. We have competition, but it is relaxed. They really try to do better and work at improving."

Working with children is a delight for Deborah, and as she talks about individual progress in the club she lights up. "I like to build

relationships and to watch the kids as they grow and develop personality" she states. Because of her interest she is working towards dual certification

in early childhood education and elementary education at Millersville State College where she is a sophomore. While working with 4-H'ers has helped her solidify her career goals, she said she has wanted to be a teacher

since she was in the fifth grade.

This year Deborah was a leader of the archery project, something which she has become proficient at over the years. She had only
