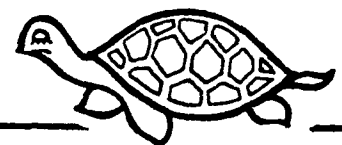
Cash and trophy awards for the winning teams and

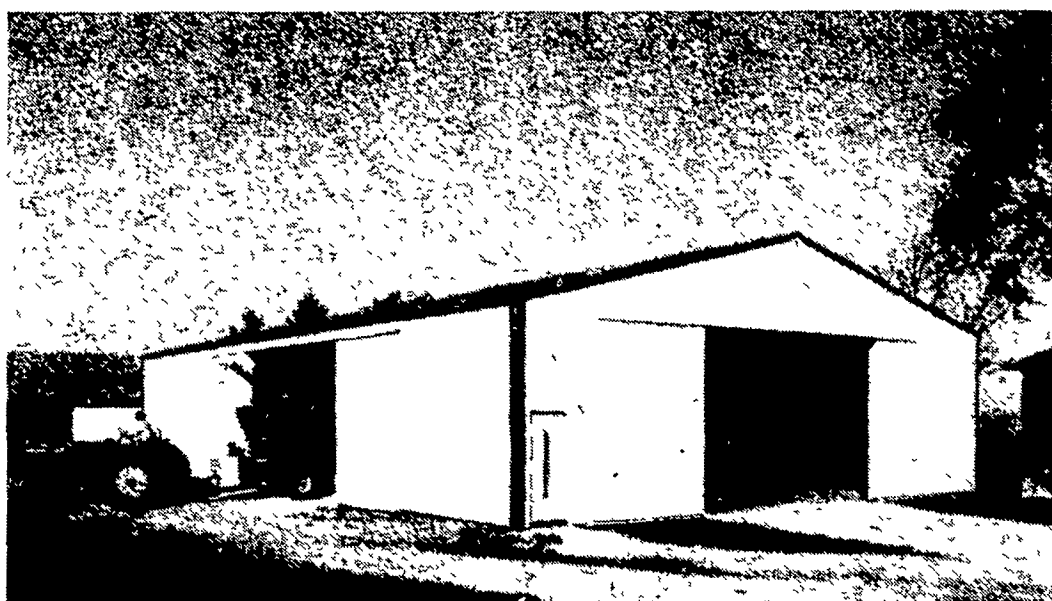
